

✿ Easy Lesson: The Future Simple (Will)

1. What is the Future Simple?

We use the future simple to talk about:

- Things that will happen later (in the future),
- Decisions made at the moment of speaking,
- Predictions.

The structure is very easy:

□ Structure

Subject + will + base verb

Examples:

I will eat.

She will study.

They will travel.

2. When do we use will?

A. To talk about future actions

Something that will happen in the future.

I will visit my grandmother tomorrow.

She will start school next year.

B. For quick decisions (decisions now)

You decide at the moment of speaking.

I'm hungry — I will make a sandwich.

The phone is ringing — I will answer it.

C.For predictions

To say what we think will happen.

It will rain today.

You will be a great teacher one day.

3.Negative Form

will not (won't)

Subject + will not (won't) + base verb

Examples:

I won't go to school tomorrow.

He won't watch the movie.

4. Questions

Will + subject + base verb?

Examples:

Will you come with us?

Will she help me?

Short answers:

Yes, I will.

No, she won't.
